DINING AND NIGHTLIFE

CUISINE RUNS MILD TO WILD, BUT ALWAYS FRESH AND TASTY

The same way Belize creates a melting pot of cultures, its restaurants create a melting pot of cuisines. Maya, mestizo, Garinagu, Creole, Chinese, Indian, and Lebanese flavors all season the melange. Creative chefs fuse traditional dishes with local Caribbean fruits like papaya and mango, to produce new flavors, aromas, and zest.

Seafood caught this morning becomes ceviche served tonight. Citric juice "cooks" the ceviche, often served with tortilla chips as an appetizer. The fresh local specialty mixes diced lobster, shrimp, or conch together with onions, peppers, tomatoes, and spices.

For an indulgent-yet-affordable entrée, order Caribbean lobster with melted butter. Placencia celebrates lobster festival each June on the first weekend of lobster season. Caye Caulker fetes the critters in July.

Belizean staples include conch, shrimp, fish, chicken, beef, and pork. Popular "stew chicken" gets spiked with habanero peppers and served with rice and beans. Thick conch soup, in a base of coconut milk, treats the palate to something unique. "Cow foot" soup results from a hearty broth of carrots, onions, garlic, cassava, and other veggies, cooked with a cow's hoof.

Influenced by Mexican and Maya cultures, tasty dishes in northern districts include *escabeche*, a tangy clear onion soup with chicken; mole (MO-lay), a spicy chocolate sauce made for chicken or pork; and *chilmole*, a dinner soup with black *recado* (mestizo seasoning), chicken, potatoes, and boiled eggs. In southern districts, Garinagu culture produces unique dishes such as *sere*, a fish chowder based on coconut milk. Hearty meals cost as little as US\$2.50.

Wedged between deep blue sea and rich green jungle, Belize makes a picturesque backdrop for its lavish cuisines. Plus the dining dollar stretches pretty far here, whether seaside or in the jungle, air-conditioned or alfresco,

Belize City buffet or outer-caye barbecue. Larger restaurants in the hotels serve international cuisine, including excellent meats. Visitors with a taste for home can even find pizza, burgers, and fries.

Nightlife in Belize City revolves around the Princess Casino, with hundreds of Vegas-style gaming machines, tables, and shows, plus separate disco, bars, theaters, and bowling alley. Nearby clubs and resorts have happy hours and live bands. On Ambergris Caye, the Jaguar's Temple, Barefoot Iguana, Fido's Courtyard, and Tacklebox feature live entertainment. In San Ignacio, check out the Stork Club in the San Ignacio Hotel. Dangriga is the source of punta, a uniquely Belizean shuffling of feet with plenty of motion below the waist.

Advertised restaurants are listed below. While this index does not include all restaurants, more appear in the Belize Tourism Industry Association directory in this book. Subject to change, prices are shown here in US dollars, although usually shown on menus in Belizean dollars. Some restaurants add a service charge to the bill, so remember to check. Most accept major cards.

Reservations are recommended.

Buena Vista. Captain Morgan's Retreat. 226-2207. Five-star dining overlooks the sea. Healthy or traditional, award-winning chefs create meals under the stars, with themed evenings, live music, beers, wines, and liquors. Opens for breakfast 6:30 to 10:30 a.m., lunch 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and dinner 6:00 to 10:00 p.m.; \$20-30. Reservations are recommended.

Casa Picasso. 226-4507. The style leader offers tapas, pastas, homemade sauces, fresh seafood, and a large dessert menu. Laid-back lounge with hip music and nightly happy hour makes a perfect spot to linger over a martini or glass of wine. Opens Monday to Saturday 5:30 to 11:00 p.m., \$4-12. Reservations are recommended.

Celi's. San Pedro Holiday Hotel. 226-2014. Try the grouper with cheddar cheese, beer batter, and a Caribbean view. Lunch 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., dinner 5:30 to 9:00 p.m., Wednesday beach barbecue with live music 6:30

p.m.; \$17-25. Celi's Deli serves johnny cakes with cheese, *panades*, and *garnaches*. Desserts include key lime pie and cheesecake.

Luna and la Habana. Journey's End Resort. 226-2173. Trendy seafront *palapa* serves "palm tree cuisine," a fusion of Caribbean and Central American fare with lobster, steak, fish, veggies, and decadent desserts.

Martini/cigar/internet bar feels like Hemingway's Cuba. Opens for breakfast and lunch 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and dinner 4:30 to 10:00 p.m.; \$10-30. Call for transportation.

Palmilla. Victoria House. 226-2067. Choose AC elegance or dining under the stars. Sample the work of executive chef Amy Knox, winner of Taste of Belize in 2003 and 2005. A tantalizing bar menu goes from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Opens for breakfast 6:30 to 9:00 a.m., lunch noon to 2:00 p.m., and dinner 6:30 to 9:00 p.m. \$20. Dinner reservations are recommended.

Ramon's Village. 226-2071. Enjoy fresh seafood in Cajun, oriental, and Belizean dishes. Come for beach barbecues and Sunday buffet. Dine inside or out on palm-shaded seaside verandas, with entertainment at the Purple Parrot. Opens for breakfast 6 to 10 a.m., lunch 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., dinner 6 to 10 p.m., and Sunday buffet 7 to 11 a.m.; \$12-20.

Rico's. Banyan Bay Villas. 226-3739. Enjoy spectacular views of the reef and Caribbean during sunrise breakfasts, beach and poolside luncheons, and romantic steak, seafood, and lobster dinners. Walk 15 minutes from San Pedro. Opens 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., \$16-44.

Belize R Us. 225-9158. Wine and dine under the stars overlooking the historic Belize River or enjoy AC inside. Features Belizean and international cuisines. Opens 7:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., with jazz happy hour on Friday, \$6-18.

Best Western Belize Biltmore Plaza. 223-2302. The disco features pulsating punta, reggae, soca, Latin, and calypso music to accompany the bold sunsets. Happy hour starts poolside at 7 p.m. on Friday, lasts until 11 p.m., and sometimes includes a live steel-drum band.

Harbour View. 223-6420. Enjoy fine dining, AC or alfresco, overlooking Belize Harbour. Sip exotic cocktails. Savor entrées merging East, West, and Belizean. Princess Hotel & Casino. 223-2670/72. Play slots, blackjack, roulette, and poker. Russian dancers perform at 10:30 p.m., and a free buffet appears at midnight. Opens noon to 4 a.m. Monday to Thursday, and 8 to 4 a.m. Friday to Sunday. Dance at Club Charisma, featuring a disc jockey Thursday to Saturday 10 p.m. to 3 a.m., with a US\$5 cover. Vogue Bar & Lounge sometimes features a band. Theaters show first-run films. A game arcade has bowling. Also find a Corozal Free Zone location and a San Ignacio Hotel location.

Opens 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Thursday to Tuesday, closed Wednesday, \$4-20.
